PROJECT FEATURE | MOVEERO, INC.

moveero, Inc.'s corporate office was moved to the Armstrong, Iowa facility in 2022. The company also announced expansion plans for the Armstrong and Estherville plants over the next two years with an estimated investment of over \$9.6 million. This expansion will increase capabilities and equipment at both the Armstrong and Estherville locations, with an expectation to create 11 jobs at a qualifying wage of \$19.05 per hour. moveero was also awarded tax credits through the High Quality Jobs (HQJ) program for this investment.



MANUFACTURING MONTH | PROCLAMATION SIGNING

The Corridor hosted a proclamation signing for city and county officials to recognize Manufacturing Month in October. Several local mayors and county supervisors participated in the signing with other supporters in attendance including Spencer Municipal Utilities and MWI Components.

Corridor staff invited local partners to Manufacturing Week tours October 10-13, 2022. Over 70 attendees toured facilities like Godbersen Metal Works in Spencer, moveero, Inc. in Estherville, Safco Products in Milford and Tyson Foods Feed Mill in Storm Lake throughout the week.
