The Place for Business



Mahaska

Corridor staff worked closely with Mahaska as they searched for a new distribution location, which they found on Highway 71 on the north side of Spencer. This location is the company's 5th warehouse in Iowa and covers 17 NW Iowa counties. Dakota Supply Group

Dakota Supply Group was recruited to the Corridor Region in 2023. The Corridor, officials from the City of Spencer, and local business leaders collaborated to assist Dakota Supply Group in finding a location within the region and closer to some of their customers.

Shell Buildings

In 2023, the Corridor partnered with Iowa Lakes Electric Cooperative, Corn Belt Power Cooperative, the City of Spencer, Clay County, and Spencer Municipal Utilities with plans to construct a 30,000 square foot speculative building in Spencer. Having a shell/speculative building in the community gives opportunity for business attraction and expansion because the structure is bare bones, making it customizable for various business purposes from warehouse space to manufacturing. **DID YOU KNOW?** MWI Components purchased Spencer's most recent shell building in 2018 and opened its East Facility there. Total sales generated from those operations are just short of \$15 million since occupying the building over 4 years ago!



Retail Coach

Two Corridor communities contracted with The Retail Coach this year to attract retail and food-service businesses to the region. The Corridor assisted in facilitating community meetings and sharing retail data to support attraction and growth.



CVN Events & Familiarization Tour

The Corridor continues to engage with The Brookshire Company and Community Venture Network to attend events and be connected with companies looking to grow or expand into rural Midwest communities. This year, the Corridor hosted Justin Erickson with The Brookshire Company for a Familiarization Tour where he visited available buildings across the region to better be able to understand what is available and market our region to these businesses. **PHOTO** - Lake Park Familiarization Tour.

SBDC AWARDS

Two regional small businesses were recognized by Senator Joni Ernst in 2023 as the Small Businesses of the Week.



Blurry Bigfoot Coffee Co. in Lake Park was the Dickinson County Small Business of the Week. The specialty coffee company started in 2021 and has both dine-in and drive-thru services serving espresso drinks, non-coffee drinks, breakfast and lunch. In 2022, owners Shelley and Paige Morris expanded the business to include a European-style bistro and bakery, and they now have plans to continue expanding through franchises in other locations.



AERO Race Wheels

AERO Race Wheels in Estherville is the leading manufacturer of high-quality steel racing wheels for dirt and asphalt racing. Owner F.L. "Skip" Miller established the business in 1995 on the conviction that the company and qualified staff could provide higher quality wheels designed specifically to endure the tough requirements and conditions of the racing industry. Their motto of "Surpassing the Standard" is their motivation for everything they do as they take personal pride in producing hundreds of race wheels daily. Since November 1997, AERO's 59 Series NASCAR wheel has won more Cup, Xfinity, and Truck Series races than all other brands combined.

MUGGABEANS COFFEE SHOP

The Iowa Lakes Corridor assists in business succession including sharing information on businesses for sale in the region, connecting potential buyers with potential sellers, and providing resources to make the transition process as smooth as possible. One business succession success in 2023 was Muggabeans Coffee Shop being sold to a new owner to keep the shop in Spencer Hospital for employees, patients, and families.

SizeUp rolled out a few new features this year, including making Spanish available for those using the data tool on the Corridor website. This addition makes the data even more accessible to some of the Corridor's small business owners and aspiring entrepreneurs.


