Fiscal Year 2021 was full of challenges and successes for all businesses throughout the region, and the lowa Lakes Corridor Development Corporation was no different. Through it all, the organization has not deviated from its mission of assisting economic growth and development in our four counties.

Our Corridor communities, businesses, and individuals pushed forward by adapting to changing work conditions, pivoting to fill needs, and showing commitment to mission. The Foundry is an incubator and coworking space in downtown Storm Lake and is part of the Lamberti Center for Rural Entrepreneurship at Buena Vista University. The first company to locate in the space was Levity, a tech company started by recent BVU graduates.
